November 5, 2007 Council Chambers

The Yacolt Town Council met in regular session on November 5, 2007, at 7:30 p.m. The call to order by Mayor Warren was followed by the flag salute. Councilmembers present were Madler, Holyk, Marbut, Weldon, and Stewart. There were visitors present.

There was a motion by Marbut, seconded by Madler to approve the minutes of the October 15, 2007 meeting. Motion Carried.

Old Business:

The Mayor provided an update from the traffic control workshop held on Monday, October 22, 2007.

Mayor Warren requested that the matter of weight restrictions on North Hubbard Avenue be added to the agenda. There was a discussion on the matter. There was a motion by Holyk, seconded by Weldon to uphold the maximum gross vehicle weights as detailed in the 2002 Washington Model Traffic Ordinance, with the Mayor to send a letter to Karl Taylor informing him of this decision. Motion Carried.

New Business:

There was a discussion on railroad crossing requirements for school busses. Laidlaw Education Services DDS Supervisor, Bud Ledbetter, was present to share concerns about the placement of various stop signs along the railroad in Yacolt. The Council offered some suggestions for Bud to share with Laidlaw.

There was a building permit application presented for James Weldon. There was a discussion on the application. There was a motion by Marbut, seconded by Stewart to approve the installation of a new water heater at 604 N. Hubbard Avenue provided that the project meets setback, placement and all other applicable zoning requirements and provided that James obtains the appropriate permits from Clark County and furnishes the Town with copies of the permits. Motion Carried.

Mayor Warren had no comments for the Council.

There was a motion by Marbut, seconded by Stewart to approve warrants #11020 through #11054 as follows: Current Expense - \$9,438.16; Fire Department - \$1,065.69; Parks Department - \$1,899.27; City Street - \$127,974.25; Cemetery - \$459.74; and Stormwater - \$865.20. Motion Carried.

Mayor Warren declared the meeting adjourned at 8:30 p.m.
